Georgia Department of Juvenile Justice and Learning House, Inc. Develop SST/504 CD for Professional Development

Louisville, KY, May 15, 2004. Dr. Denzil Edge, President/CEO of Learning House, Inc., a comprehensive eLearning company headquartered in Louisville, KY, is pleased to announce a partnership with the Georgia Department of Juvenile Justice for the development of a new multi-media product aimed at educating personnel on the procedures of conducting Student Support Teams and Section 504 procedural guidelines – a civil rights law providing equitable access to education for students with disabilities. The multi-media product will be a CD-based flash presentation that incorporates audio and video as well as traditional text to provide an engaging learning experience for educators in Georgia's Department of Juvenile Justice. This is the third of seven CDs that will be produced for GDJJ. The first CD provided an introduction to the field of special education. The second CD focused on strategies for managing the behavior of youth in a classroom environment in a Regional Youth Detention Center. All CDs are used to train new personnel (special education teachers, juvenile justice officers, nurses, counselors, and regular teachers) in the procedures of educating and managing children and youth served by the GDJJ special school district.

The Department of Juvenile Justice provides supervision, detention and a wide range of treatment and educational services for youths referred to the Department by the Juvenile Courts, and provides assistance or delinquency prevention services for at-risk youths through collaborative efforts with other public, private and community entities. Over 59,000 youths are served annually, including youths who are placed on probation, sentenced to short-term incarceration, or committed to the Department's custody by Juvenile Courts.
